Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest. Throughout the season of Lent we were reminded that, even though we have forsaken your love, your love has never forsaken us. Your grace is more amazing than our sin, your peace is more comforting than our strength, your spirit is more powerful than our fear. In the life, ministry, death, and resurrection of Jesus, you revealed your grace, your peace, and your strength to the world. His words taught us the way of life, his acts showed us the way of life, and his death and resurrection opens the way of life for us all. And so, today, we praise you for the victory over sin and death which we have in Jesus Christ, your Son, our Lord:

Pastor: Hallelujah! Christ is Risen!

People: The Lord is Risen indeed! Hallelujah!

THE GREAT THANKSGIVING CONTINUES...

On the night in which he gave himself up for us, our Lord Jesus took bread, gave thanks to you, broke the bread, gave it to his disciples, and said: "Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me." When the supper was over he took the cup, gave thanks to you, gave the cup to his disciples and said: "Drink from this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, poured out for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me." On the day you raised Jesus from the dead he was recognized by his disciples in the breaking of the bread; and in the power of your Holy Spirit we your Church have continued in the breaking of the bread and the sharing of the cup. And so, in remembrance of these your mighty acts in Jesus Christ, we offer ourselves in praise and thanksgiving as a holy and living sacrifice, in union with Christ's offering for us, as we proclaim the mystery of faith:

People: Christ has died Christ is risen Christ will come again.
