

Adult Sunday School completed their study of *Uncomfortable Conversations with a Black Man* by Emmanuel Acho. Mr. Acho is the son of Nigerian parents who immigrated to the USA. They made their home in Dallas, Texas in an upper middle class suburban neighborhood. He attended a private school and explains in the book that his early introduction to American Black culture was only two times a week at church functions. When he went to college at the University of Texas, he was surrounded by more black culture than he had been exposed to before. After college, he played in the NFL and personally could see how his stable upbringing differed from many of his black teammates.

As he looks back at his personal experiences, he calls himself fluent in both white and black cultures as he has lived in both for large parts of his life. This has left him uniquely qualified to write this book. It is written in an easy conversational style, including footnoted history lessons, starting with the first black slaves brought to Virginia in 1619. He traces overt racism through 400 years of American history and brings a unique outlook on racism with well researched historical happenings to conflicts in present day America. The reader doesn't have to agree with every point he makes in order to appreciate the overall message of the book.

Each chapter covers a particular part of racism, and he ends each chapter with his suggestions for Americas journey on the road for true racial equality. It is too extensive a topic to cover completely in this brief summary. The book is well written and the overall topic, with its component parts, is well documented and current. Copyright date is 2020 and can be purchased on kindle for less than \$10.

In his final summary, Mr. Acho has a to-do list which suggests making intentional actions with people of color. These can include frequenting black-owned businesses, particularly bookstores and gyms. Suggestions also include investigating the principles for diversity at your workplace and exploring courses in black culture, history, and literature. Using many sports analogies, he suggests we need to now get out of the huddle and get in the game.
