

When the supper was over, and Jesus prepared to face his darkest fears, he took the cup, gave thanks to you, and gave it, even to disciples who would betray and reject him, saying: "Drink from this, all of you; this is my life poured out for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me."

With joy and gratitude, we break this bread, remembering the many times Jesus was revealed to his disciples in the breaking of the bread.

## In remembrance, we will take and eat this bread.

With faith and hope, we take this cup, remembering Jesus' ongoing gifts of grace and forgiveness, poured out for disciples yesterday, today and forevermore.

# In remembrance, we will take and drink of this cup.

And so, in remembrance of these your mighty acts and signs of light and life in Jesus Christ, we offer ourselves in praise and thanksgiving as signs of light and life in union with Christ's offering for us as we proclaim the mystery of faith.

Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

Pour out your Holy Spirit on all of us gathered here, that we may be your light in the world. Pour out your Holy Spirit on these gifts of bread and wine, that we may be filled with your glory and grace.
