

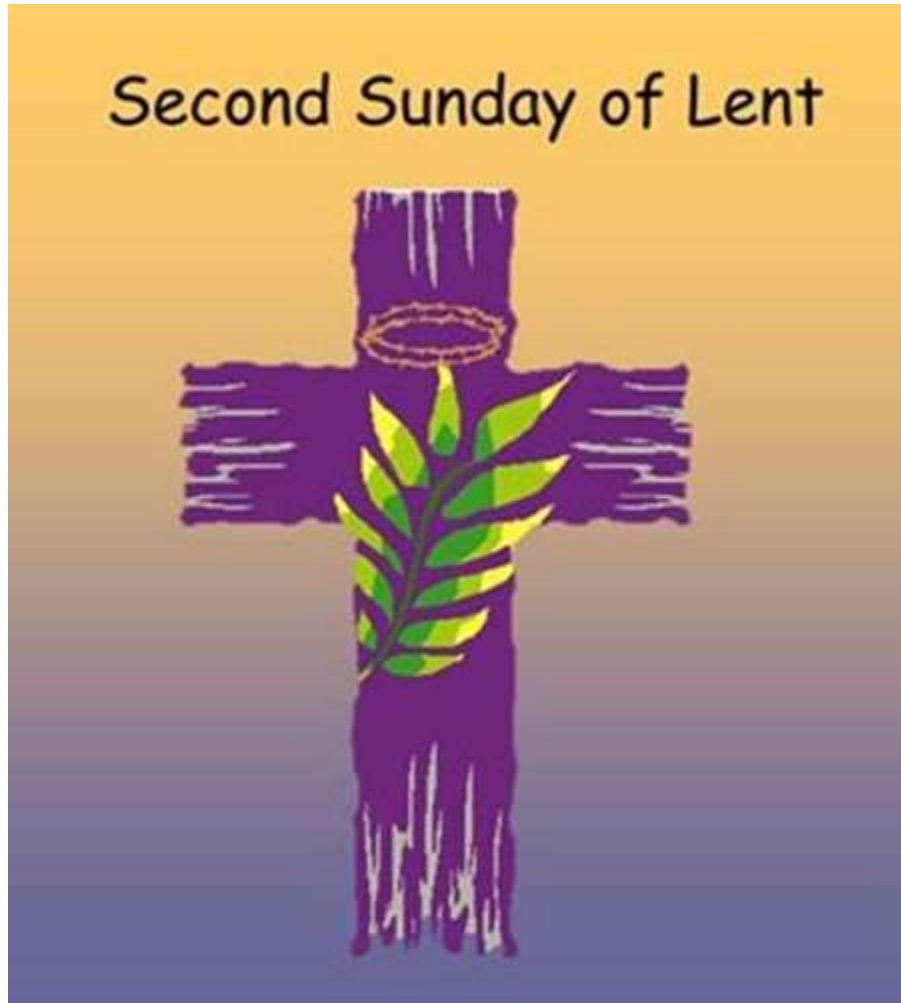

THE GREAT THANKSGIVING

Pastor: May God be with you.

People: It is right to give our thanks and praise.

It is truly right and our greatest joy to give you thanks and praise, O Lord our God, creator and ruler of the universe. When our ancestors were slaves in Egypt, strangers in the land, you saw our suffering, heard our cries, and came to deliver us— bringing us out of captivity into a land flowing with milk and honey.

When the supper was over, he took the cup, gave thanks to you, gave it to his disciples, and said: "Drink from this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, poured out for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me."

UMCOR IN TURKEY AND SYRIA

We see the devastation and human toll the earthquake has brought to Turkey and Syria. We have all seen the reports of the recent chemical disaster unfolding in Ohio and Pennsylvania due to the train derailment. The Mission Barn in New Castle was able to send health kits and cleaning buckets to our friends in need as they weather the effects of what has happened in East Palestine, Ohio, which is a half mile from the Pennsylvania border. When we assemble our kits, we never know how close or far away they will go. We are glad to know we can have a small part in lightening the worries of our neighbors, especially the farmers whose livelihoods are threatened in the wake of this environmental nightmare.
